Shaikha Nasser Al Nowais Breaks Global Barrier: Becomes First Woman to Lead UN Tourism in 50 Years

DUBAI: In a landmark moment for global leadership and gender representation, Shaikha Nasser Al Nowais has been elected as the first woman to head UN Tourism, marking a historic shift in the organisation's 50-year history. Her appointment was endorsed during the 123rd UN Tourism Executive Council session held in Segovia, Spain, and awaits formal ratification by the UN General Assembly. Shaikha Al Nowais will



assume office in January 2026, beginning a four-year term at the helm of the United Nations' specialised agency responsible for steering global efforts towards responsible, sustainable, and accessible tourism. Her leadership arrives at a defining moment as the sector works to rebuild resilience, expand inclusivity, and redefine priorities in a post-pandemic world. The appointment is widely hailed as a transformative step for gender equality in international institutions. For the first time since the organisation's founding in 1975, a woman will guide the policies and initiatives shaping the future of tourism across continents.

Saudi Arabia Unveils 'Visa by Profile', Offering Instant e-Tourist Visas to Eligible Travellers

RIYADH: Saudi Arabia has taken a major leap in simplifying global travel access with the launch of its groundbreaking "Visa by Profile" initiative, a first-of-its-kind system that allows eligible international visitors to obtain an electronic tourist visa within minutes. The announcement was made by Tourism Minister Ahmed Al-Khateeb during the TOURISE 2025 summit in Riyadh, marking a significant milestone in

the Kingdom's ambitious plan to become a global tourism powerhouse by 2030.

The new programme enables qualified Visa cardholders to skip traditional, time-consuming visa procedures. By simply entering their card and passport details, travellers can instantly receive an e-Tourist visa—streamlining a process that previously involved extensive documentation and waiting periods.

Announcing the initiative on his official X account, Al-Khateeb said: "We proudly introduce 'Visa by Profile' – the world's first initiative allowing eligible Visa cardholders to instantly secure their electronic tourist visa in minutes, just by using their card and passport details."

The move aligns with Saudi Arabia's broader strategy to boost international arrivals and strengthen its position as a major global

tourism destination. With innovations such as "Visa by Profile," the Kingdom aims to attract millions more visitors, enhance traveller convenience, and reinforce its image as a progressive and accessible tourism hub.

The initiative is expected to play a pivotal role in supporting Vision 2030, which seeks to diversify the nation's economy and promote the tourism sector as a key driver of growth.

Australia's New Student Visa Cap Kicks In: Indian Applicants Brace for Slower Processing

CANBERRA: Australia's revamped approach to managing international student inflows came into effect today, reshaping visa processing timelines for thousands of aspirants — including a large cohort from India. The new system, introduced under Ministerial Direction 115 (MD 115), links the speed of Subclass 500 student

The tiered framework marks a significant shift from the earlier MD 111 directive. Under MD 115, institutions are categorised into three priority bands based on their utilisation of the government-assigned "New Overseas Student Commencements" quota.

Universities and colleges operating at below 80%

Industry experts say the new rule is effectively a regulatory tightening aimed at curbing the surge in international student numbers, which has grown sharply in recent years. But for many prospective students — particularly from India, one of Australia's largest source markets — the change introduces fresh uncertainty just as universities prepare for the upcoming academic intake.

Migration consultants anticipate that colleges and private institutes already operating near full capacity could see the steepest delays. This may push students to reconsider their institution choices or recalibrate their timelines.

Australian authorities maintain that the cap-linked processing model will help ensure quality, manage infrastructure pressure and strengthen integrity across the international education sector.

Emirates Issues December Travel Advisory as Dubai Braces for Record Passenger Surge

DUBAI: Emirates has issued a travel advisory ahead of what is expected to be one of the busiest Decembers in recent years, with more than 2.3 million passengers departing and 2.5 million arriving in Dubai over the month.

The airline attributes the surge to peak tourist season, major events across the city and the updated KHDA school calendar, all of which are set to intensify airport traffic through several upcoming weekends. To ensure a smooth trav-

el experience, Emirates is urging passengers to plan ahead and allow additional time for airport formalities. The carrier has advised travellers to arrive at Dubai International Airport at least three hours before departure, clear immigration 90 minutes prior to take-off and reach the boarding gate one hour ahead.

The airline cautioned that heavier road traffic, busier parking areas and longer processing times are expected throughout December.

With the launch of the Cultural Visa 2025, Oman signals its commitment to nurturing a vibrant, diverse, and globally connected cultural ecosystem — one that welcomes creative minds not just to visit, but to belong.

GULF FAQs

Can UAE govt prosecute a person outside the country?

Can the UAE govt prosecute a person outside the country for committing a crime? What about if the person is already acquitted in another country? Is extradition treaty between countries necessary? As students travel abroad for studies and Emirati families settle in foreign countries, cultural clashes may arise, with the social sensitivities of a different land hard to adapt to for those used to UAE norms. However, what about laws? Do legal rights and requirements of a foreign land get overruled by UAE law? Do citizens have to abide by UAE laws no matter which country they are in?

This newspaper spoke to lawyers to get a better understanding of what cases UAE can extend its jurisdiction in. While the UAE Penal Code primarily applies to crimes committed on UAE territory, the

jurisdiction extends further in some cases, according to Dr Hassan Elhais, legal consultant at Awatif Mohammad Shoqi Advocates & Legal Consultancy. This includes cases where the UAE can prosecute its citizens, and cases where the Emirates can take legal action against any person, regardless of nationality. An Emirati citizen who commits a crime abroad can be penalised for it upon their return to the country, under Article 23 of the UAE Penal Code. This is provided that the crime is punishable under both UAE law and the laws of the country where the crime was committed, Hassan said. It is important to note that the "jurisdictional reach applies regardless of whether the offense was committed against a fellow Emirati or not," according to Bassem Ehab, Senior Associate at Habib Al Mulla and Partners.

However, prosecution

will not proceed if the individual has already been acquitted or convicted by a final judgment in the country where the offence was committed, Bassem said. While Emiratis can be prosecuted by UAE for any crime committed abroad, given certain conditions, people of other nationalities can be punished by UAE only for specific types of crimes committed outside the country mentioned in Article 21 and 22, according to Hassan. Bassem detailed the offences that grants extraterritorial application of UAE laws under Article 21 of the UAE Penal Code. This applies to anyone who commits an act as a principal or accomplice in any of the following crimes: Offences against the UAE's internal or external security, constitutional structure or crimes involving



the forgery or counterfeiting of official seals, government-issued financial instruments or stamps; forgery, counterfeiting, or falsification of UAE currency, whether committed within or outside the country, including the distribution or possession of such currency with intent to distribute. Forgery or falsification of paper money or coins that are legal tender in the UAE, including their distribution or possession for distribution purposes; premeditated murder of a UAE citizen, regardless of where the act was committed Under Article 22, "the UAE can also prosecute

any person who is found in the UAE after committing a major international crime like terrorism, human trafficking or money laundering anywhere in the world," Hassan said. Article 22 also extends to distribution of drugs — whether as a principal or accomplice — committed outside the UAE should the perpetrator return to the UAE regardless of their nationality, Bassem said.

Moreover, if certain actions committed abroad amount to a crime partially or fully committed in the UAE, the perpetrator can be held accountable under UAE law, he added.

Can a landlord charge different rents to tenants of same building?

I live in a two-bedroom apartment in Dubai. I recently found out that my neighbour — who lives in a similar apartment — pays about Dh5,000 less than I do because he pays the rent in a single cheque. Is it legal for landlords to charge tenants higher rent based on the number of instalments?

In Dubai, the rent must be specified in a tenancy contract. If the owner of a property and a tenant fail to specify the rent in the tenancy contract, the rent will be determined based on the rent of a similar



property. This is in accordance with Article-9 of the Dubai Tenancy Law, which states: "Landlords and tenants must specify rent in the tenancy contracts. If the parties fail to specify the rent and it is impossible to prove the rent

agreed upon by them, the rent will be the rental value of similar real property."

Furthermore, there is no specific provision that mandates the owner of the property to charge the same rent amount

regardless of the number of cheque payments. Rent amounts and payment terms are subject to the agreement between an owner of the property and a tenant, provided that the agreed rent does not exceed the maximum threshold set by the Dubai Land Department (DLD) rental index and as per Dubai Decree No. 43 of 2013 on rent increases. An owner of a property may, at its discretion, offer lower rent when a tenant makes payment in fewer instalments.

Therefore, if the rent charged to you falls with-

in the permissible range of the DLD rental index, it may not be considered unlawful for the owner of a property to offer different rent based on the number of cheques. In accordance with the aforementioned, the owner of a property in Dubai may generally charge at its discretion varying rent amounts depending on the number of instalments agreed, provided the rent complies with the DLD rental index. You may verify your current rent through the DLD website to ensure it aligns with the prevailing rental index.

India, Bahrain to strengthen mutual ties

NEW DELHI: External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar discussed measures to strengthen the "long-standing multifaceted partnership" with Bahrain during a phone call with his counterpart Dr Abdullah bin Rashid Al Zayani. "Good to speak with FM Dr Abdullah bin Rashid Al Zayani of Bahrain over the phone," Jaishankar, who is currently visiting New York, posted on social media. The two ministers also discussed regional and global developments. This would help eliminate double taxation, deepen our longstanding multifaceted partnership. Also exchanged views on current regional and global developments," Jaishankar said.

The two ministers held extensive talks earlier this month in New Delhi when India and Bahrain announced commencing negotiations for an ambitious trade deal, inching closer to sealing an investment pact. They also agreed to develop a common understanding to commence negotiations for a double taxation avoidance agreement (DTAA). This would help eliminate double taxation, provide tax certainty and promote trade and investment, officials had said.

Bahrain is an important country for India in West Asia, and the overall bilateral relations have witnessed a major upswing in the last few years, with two-way trade reaching \$1.64 billion in 2024-25.

The Gulf nation has been home to close to 3.32 lakh Indian nationals who comprise nearly a quarter of the total population of 1.5 million in that country. India is among the top five trading partners of Bahrain.

tor. But with institutions still adjusting to the new thresholds, the coming weeks will be crucial in determining how deeply MD 115 impacts student mobility and the broader education landscape.

For now, Indian students planning their 2025 study abroad journeys have been advised to apply early, stay updated on their institution's priority status and be prepared for possible fluctuations in processing times.
