## Over a million pilgrims begin Haj

**MECCA:** More than a million pilgrims joined Islam's most important rite under a beating sun as the Haj kicked off with the Saudi hosts scrambling to avoid any accident.

With temperatures expected to top 40 degrees Celsius robed pilgrims slowly circled the Kaaba -- the black cube at the heart of Mecca's Grand Mosque which is Islam's holiest site. State media reported that others had begun arriving in the sprawling tent city of Mina on Mecca's outskirts where they will stay overnight before the Haj's high-point-prayers on Mount Arafat, where the Prophet Mohammed is believed to have delivered his final sermon. About 1.4 million pilgrims arrived in Saudi Arabia ahead of the Haj one of the five pillars of Islam that must be performed at least once by all Muslims with the means.

Authorities have ratcheted up heat protection measures such as extra shade to avoid a repeat of last year, when 1,301 people died as temperatures hit 51.8C.



Now pilgrims will perform the tawaf -- walking seven times around the Kaaba, which Muslims pray towards each day. Before entering Mecca, pilgrims must first enter a state of pu-

rity, called Ihram, which requires special dress and behaviour. Men don a seamless shroud-like white garment that emphasises unity among believers, regardless of their social status or nationality. Women, in turn, wear loose dresses, also white, exposing just their faces and hands. Pilgrims arriving on buses had begun already trickling into Mina greeted by staff offering them coffee and dates. "I am so happy, it's such an amazing feeling," said Reem al-Shogre, a 35-year-old Saudi performing the pilgrimage for the first time.

## Unified GCC visa to be launched soon

**KUWAIT CITY:** The Gulf Cooperation Council (GCC) is planning to implement a unified tourist visa, similar to the Schengen visa, allowing travel across all six member states: Saudi Arabia, the UAE, Oman, Kuwait, Qatar and Bahrain. This single visa would streamline travel and encourage tourism and business collaboration within the region.

## India shines at IATA meet

The three-day AGM of the influential International Air Transport Association (IATA), representing about 350 airlines, in New Delhi tried its best to mitigate various grievances of the industry, particularly the negative impact of Donald Trump's policies that have hit travel to the US and raised cost for travel in a cascading effect. Trump's bid to impose tariffs on the US' trading partners has upended commercial flows, with legal challenges against his plan adding to uncertainties. The volume of travel also is likely to suffer further with the tense atmosphere in the US, from Trump's plans to revoke foreign students' visas to reports of travellers being detained at US airports. As speakers pointed out at the AGM, any form of uncertainty will reduce traffic, particularly it will impact business travellers, the most profitable segment for the airlines. It may be recalled that in December last, IATA had forecast a record 5.2 billion air journeys in 2025 -- up 6.7pc from an already record 2024. It predicted carriers would generate \$36.6 billion in cumulative net profit, on revenue exceeding \$1 trillion. Alas, Trump's "Liberation Day" tariff blitz and his administration's stance on issues from immigration to education could throw a spanner in the works.

A study released this month by the World Travel and Tourism Council and Oxford Economics found that the US was on track to lose some \$12.5 billion in revenue from foreign tourists this year owing to worries about travelling to the country. The group, made up of leading travel firms, said this "represents a direct blow to the US economy overall, impacting communities jobs and businesses.

IATA Director General Willie Walsh noted the existence of "some signs of fragility of consumer and business confidence with continued weakness in the US domestic market and a sharp fall in North American premium class travel". Air transport has for decades benefited from the removal of import taxes, rising living standards -- particularly in Asia -- and open borders, with the number of air trips tripling since 2000.

The terrible demand for new aircraft and the manufacturers' inability to keep the supply line rolling is putting more burden on carriers. But the saving grace is the falling oil prices owing to an anticipated slowdown in economic growth. That could help firms reduce their fuel bills -- representing between a quarter and a third of their operational costs -- by hundreds of millions of dollars. India is experiencing an explosive aviation growth, with the number of airports and passengers in the world's most populous nation doubling over the past decade under the Modi administration. The middle class, which benefited the most from liberal economic policies, is enjoying the fruits of aviation expansion.

India came out with flying colours with its domestic traffic registering a 10pc growth. IATA director general Willi Walsh described Indian aviation's growth in the last few year as a "phenomenal one". As Prime Minister Narendra Modi rightly put it, Indian aviation sector offers a huge investment opportunity. India is investing in world class airports and the number of airports in India has increased to 162 frm 74. India is today world's third largest domestic aviation market.

## Missing Indians rescued by Iran

**NEW DELHI:** The three Indian nationals who went missing in Iran last month have been successfully rescued, the Iranian embassy in India said, citing local media reports. The embassy confirmed on the social media platform X that Tehran police had freed the missing individuals. "Three missing Indian citizens freed by Tehran police. Local media in Iran say police have found and released three Indian men who had gone missing in Iran," the Iranian embassy posted.

All three individuals, identified as Jaspal Singh, Hushanpreet Singh, and Amritpal Singh, hail from Punjab and had disappeared shortly after landing in Tehran on May 1. According to the Iranian news agency Mehr, the men were on their way to Australia after being promised lucrative jobs by a local travel company. The trio was reportedly rescued following a police operation target-

ing the hostage-takers. The Indian embassy had issued a statement following an approach by the family members of the missing men, who expressed serious concern over their relatives' sudden disappearance.

Ashok Kumar, the elder brother of Jaspal Singh, had told a TV channel that the fami-

lies had collectively paid over Rs 19 lakh to the agents. "Jaspal was first taken to Dubai on April 1 and kept there for a month. Amritpal and Hushanpreet also joined him in Dubai on April 25 after paying the full amount. They were then flown to Tehran in early May on separate flights," he said.

## Telugu medico dies in Vietnam road mishap

**HYDERABAD:** A tragic accident claimed the life of ArshidAshrith, a 21-year-old third-year MBBS student, in Can Tho City, Vietnam. Ashrith, son of cloth merchants Arshid Arjun and Pratimah from Kagaznagar town, was riding a motorcycle at high speed with a friend

when he lost control and crashed into a house wall.

The incident occurred in the early morning hours. Ashrith died at the scene, while the other who sustained serious injuries, is receiving treatment. Arrangements are underway to repatriate Ashrith's body to India.

## Air India to operate Delhi-Manila non-stop flight after 12 years

MUMBAI: Air India is all set to operate Delhi-Manila flights from Oct, connecting India and the Philippines with non-stop flights after 12

years. The announcement comes close on the heels of the Philippines making travel to the country visa-free for Indian tourists for up to 14 days,

joining other Southeast Asian countries like Thailand and Malaysia. Non-stop flights between India and the Philippines were last operated

in 2013 by Philippine Airlines, when the carrier suspended the service due to low demand. But a lot has changed over the past 12 years, with sig-

nificant growth in outbound travel from India and various countries, particularly in Southeast Asia, vying for Indian tourist footfalls.

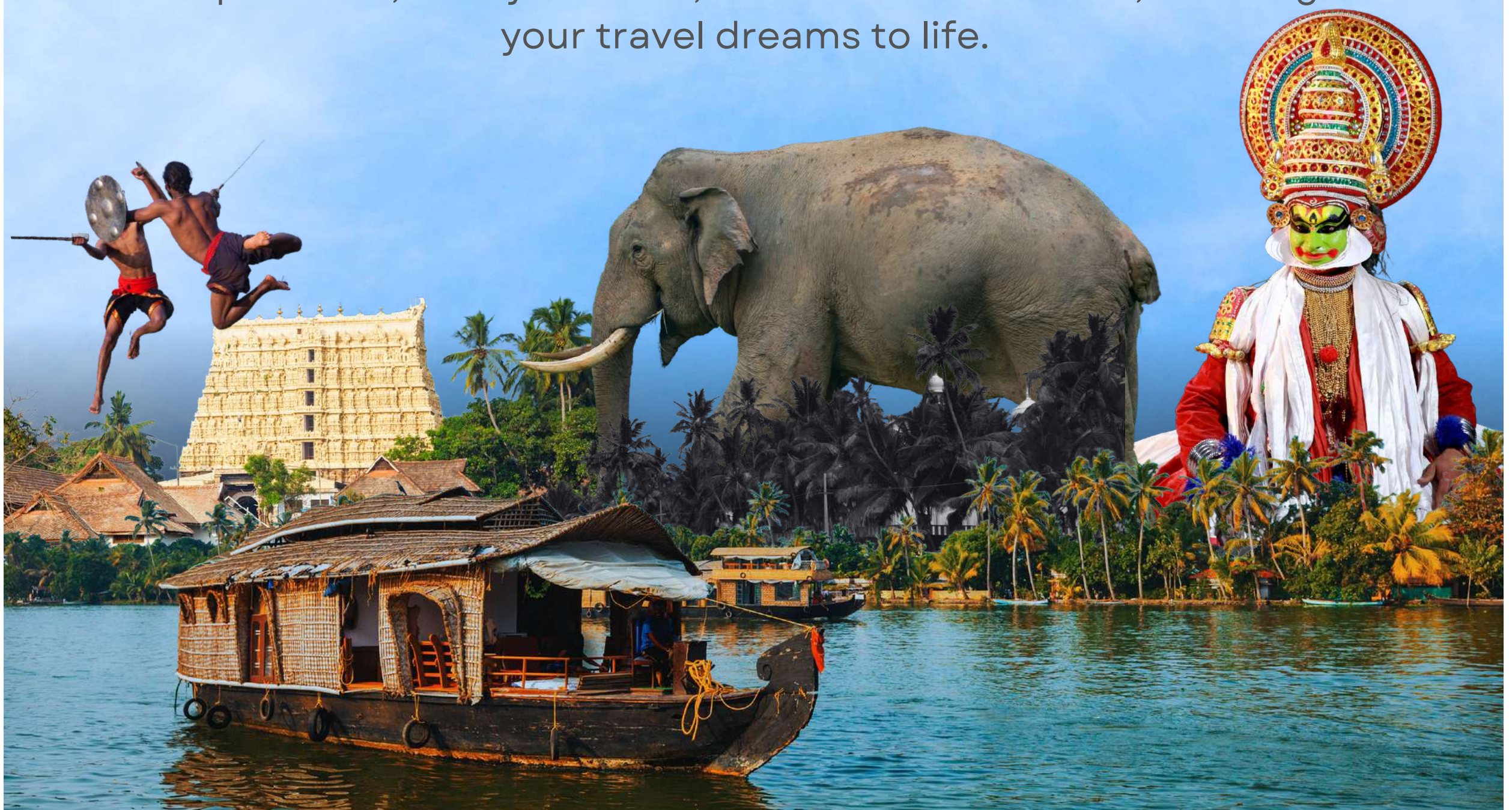

## Can employer demand police clearance certificate from new employee?

I have been offered a job in a Dubai-based company, but I have been told that I may be required to produce a police clearance certificate. Is this legal/normal? What does the police clearance assess and what is the procedure to get one?

An employer in Dubai, or UAE, may request a Police Clearance Certificate (PCC) as part of their pre-employment screening process. Such a request is made to ensure that a prospective employee does not have any criminal record.

However, there is no specific federal legislation presently in force explicitly mandating the submission of PCC for



employment. The PCC serves to verify whether the applicant has any criminal convictions or ongoing investigations. PCC may be a requirement depending on the employer's internal HR/hiring policies and the nature of the position.

Furthermore, to obtain a PCC, you may apply through the Dubai Police

official website and app or the official website of the Ministry of Interior, UAE. You may need to provide valid identification documents such as a passport, Emirates ID, fingerprints and payment of relevant fees. Under the service of PCC, you can apply for a certificate confirming an individual's good conduct.

## Divorce and sponsorship

**My children and I live in Dubai under my husband's sponsorship. If we decide to get divorced, will my husband be required to continue sponsoring our residency in the UAE? What rights do I have in this situation, especially since I am a homemaker?**

As you're a foreigner living in the UAE on your husband's sponsorship, the provisions of Cabinet Resolution No. 65 of 2022 Issuing the Executive Regulations of Federal Law by Decree No. 29 of 2021 Concerning the Entry and Residence of Foreigners (the "Cabinet Resolution No. 65 of 2022") are applicable. In the UAE, if a woman gets divorced while

living in the country on her husband's sponsorship, she is entitled to apply for a one-year extension of her UAE residency visa. This extension starts from the official date of the divorce.

Furthermore, the benefit of this visa extension also extends to the children from the marriage, provided they were previously under the father's sponsorship at the time of the divorce. It's important to note that divorce in the UAE also involves matters such as child custody, alimony and child maintenance, in accordance with the prevailing personal laws of the UAE or UAE Federal Law No. 28 of 2005.



# Indian aviation will grow faster than China : IATA DG Willie Walsh

**NEW DELHI:** India's domestic aviation market will grow at a faster pace than China with fleet expansion and the development of new airports, International Air Transport Association's Director General Willie Walsh has said.

"If you look at the domestic markets from 2020 to 2024 both India and China have grown at the same pace -- CAGR of 11.2pc but going forward I think the rate of growth in India will be higher than that of Chi-



na. China will still grow very strongly but I believe number one growth economy from an aviation point of view will be India," Walsh said at

the conclusion of IATA's annual general meeting event in Delhi.

While India which is third largest domestic air traffic market (US is

number one ), is a long way behind China, will see a lot of growth with the expansion of fleet and network by airlines like IndiGo and construction of new airports, Walsh said.

Walsh said that simple and clear tax regime in India will also help the country to address it's growth potential. "Issues related to taxation need to be addressed for India to fully exploit it's potential and translate it's vision into reality," he remarked.

IATA Director General also called for a greater dialogue between airlines and airports on development of efficient and affordable airports.

"Many airports around the world and I am not just picking on India here don't fully understand the needs of airlines. What we get is development which is not appropriate for the airlines which have to operate at airports that are more expensive than what airlines believe they should be," he remarked.



## AI chief visualises strong growth in its business

**NEW DELHI:** Air India sees huge upside in passenger as well as cargo segments and is always open for partnerships, its chief Campbell Wilson said as the full service airline works to upgrade its aircraft, improve service quality and expand networks.

The loss-making Air India, being piloted by the Tata Group since its take over in Jan 2022, is undergoing the ambitious five-year transformation plan "Vihaan.AI" that commenced in 2022, with Wilson saying he is very happy with the trajectory, notwithstanding that there is more work to do.

The Air India CEO and MD said the airline "just learns to adapt and move on" when there are external factors such as supply chain and airspace issues.

"When you are trying to do a turnaround, there are so many things that require us to act to prove ourselves... the objective is very very clear and hasn't changed in the slightest, the opportunity hasn't changed in the

slightest, in fact if anything it has got clearer at the scale of the opportunity," he said.

The airline sees a huge upside on the passenger as well as cargo business sides, Wilson said, adding that since privatisation, the cargo revenues have increased more than three times. The passenger revenues have more than doubled during the same period.

"Again, huge upside, non-stop service into key points around the world, more focus on cargo, better systems, more consistent product delivery, all of these things mean we are a much more credible player in the cargo space. (There is) significant upside opportunity," he noted.

Currently, Air India has a fleet of 191 planes, including 64 wide-bodies and 127 narrow bodies. When asked whether Air India will also be looking at a partnership with upcoming Riyadh Air, he said there is an air about India. "Everyone wants a partnership with India and so we are talking to many many people".

## SuiHub MENA, VARA to strengthen Dubai's virtual asset ecosystem

In addition to joint events and resources for founders, SuiHub MENA will facilitate introductions between VARA and ecosystem projects while contributing insights for economic policy development. Both organisations will explore co-authored research and publications focused on the industry's evolution.
